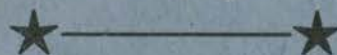

### LONDON HOSPITAL.

We welcome the Doctors from London Hospital to-day, and trust they will enjoy both the game and a short stay afterwards with us in the Club House. It will be their first visit to us as far as all those who should know can remember. All hospital teams have the reputation of throwing the ball about, and so we should see a game such as a holiday crowd will enjoy. It is said that London Hospital have been in the final of the Hospital Cup Tournament more times than any other team, and we know that they won it this season, so that they must have a side fully capable of extending our boys, who, however, showed welcome improvement at Newbridge last week. For Bath to win in Wales is certainly well worth mentioning. The Hospital have had a good season, and are sure to make every endeavour to put up a good show here on their first appearance.

### THE REF.

To-day's referee, Mr Vernon Parfitt, of Newport, first had charge of a Bath game at Cardiff, and afterwards was invited to do the return here. He has had a match at Bath every season since, and has been in charge of International games at Twickenham and Belfast, Army, Navy, R.A.F. Services games, and Welsh Secondary and Welsh Schoolboys' International games. Last Saturday, the 13th, he did the Wales v. England Schoolboys' game at Cardiff, having been placed on a panel of three referees by England. He has charge of eight Barbarian games, and has given 20 years service with the whistle since retiring from playing in 1936. As an administrator, he has served on the Newport Committee for the past 15 years, and is a past Chairman of the Monmouthshire Society of referees. He will finish this season at Bathford on the 29th, when he will be doing Avonvale F.C. v. Alan Gibson's XV. Many of his countrymen regard him as one of the best Wales has produced.
