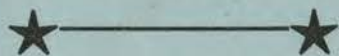

THE MAJOR CHANGES IN THE LAWS OF OUR GAME.**LAWS 2 and 14 KNOCK ON.**

An unintentional knock on direct from a KICK will not be an infringement provided that the player recovers the ball before it touches the ground or another player.

The law permits the fumble from a PASS ; it will, however, still be a knock on (a) if a player attempting to grasp the ball with one hand knocks it forward or (b) if a player attempts to grasp the ball with both hands, but the ball plainly bounces forward off his hands. It is NOT a knock on if a player attempts to grasp the ball with both hands and any forward movement of the ball is immediately checked as part of the same attempt without loss of control. The intention of the alteration is to permit what has become termed "the fumble".

LAW 15 SCRUMMAGE.

The near foot of the hooker on the TIGHT HEAD side is permitted to strike at the ball on equal terms with the far foot of the loose head hooker. These feet may not be placed or moved nearer to the mouth of the tunnel than the normal position until the ball has left the hands of the player putting it in.

Kicking the ball out of the tunnel of the scrummage by front row players is not permitted.

LAW 16 TACKLE.

Players are permitted to play the ball after a tackle in any lawful way, except that a player lying on the ground may not interfere with the ball in any way before REGAINING HIS FEET.
