

OUR VISITORS TO-DAY.

We extend to-day a very hearty welcome to the Chippenham Rugby Club who are doing a great deal to foster Rugger in the County of Wilts. In the first match of the season at Chippenham, our own lads defeated the Chippenham Club by 16 pts. to 5 pts., but whatever the result to-day there is no doubt that there will be a fine sporting game.

THE END OF THE SEASON.

All Rugger men must feel very aggrieved at the action taken by the Ministry concerned over the question of the re-instatement of the West Stand. Why should some Clubs in certain parts of the country be allowed to spend plenty of money on ground improvements, as has been the case and one of the premier Rugger Clubs in the kingdom be penalised financially, in being unable, through no fault of its own, to provide adequate accommodation for their members and would-be members? It is not as if the Stand were not there before the war. The Bath Club is asking only for that which is justly due to them and I am certain that both the Committee and those more famous people who are working on the Club's behalf, will leave no stone unturned until they finally secure what they are seeking.

I am sure the Committee would wish to extend thanks to all those patrons of the Club, who have given unerring support throughout the season and here's hoping when the teams trot out for the first home match next season, we shall be able to see our Stand, a real Stand, in its right place on the West Side of the Ground.
