Did YOU know?

The more the laws are studied the more light is shed on their implications. The "Don'ts" in rugger are really comparitively few. A player may not pass forward, prevent the ball being put fairly into the scrummage, lie on the ball, handle the ball directly after a tackle, or be or remain offside.

Did you know that a Captain may choose a scrum although the referee has awarded his team a penalty kick? A scrum half can choose which side of the scrummage he puts the ball in, but having chosen, he is not allowed to change sides.
