Mark Jones passed away on Saturday, October 10th, 1992. He was 29 years of age.

ANDY ROBINSON, Captain Bath F.C. (R.F.U.) writes: I first met Mark on the Playing Fields at Huish Grammar School, Taunton. It was 1975. He was already a skilful second-row forward and seemed set for a very promising rugby career.

He was also a very good all-round sportsman, notably at cricket, golf and football. A renowned hitter of sixes he once held four catches in a School 1st XI match.

Whilst still at school, he turned out for Taunton in the second row. His passing is a great loss to us all.

We would like to send our respects to his family.

MARK'S last game of Rugby was for Clifton against Torquay on October 26, 1991. He was a second-row forward and played 36 games for Bath scoring six tries. His League appearances totalled 22.

He played for Somerset on four occasions. After Bath, he went to Swansea before joining Clifton as they embarked on Third Division Rugby for the first time and he took part in the Club's first Gloucestershire Cup Final for eighteen years.
