

The Old Blues

Once again we extend to our annual Boxing Day friends a real Christmas welcome. They have provided our after Christmas Day fare for many years now and have never failed to give us a fast open game such as a holiday crowd comes

out to see and enjoy.

The Old Blues are one of the oldest clubs in the country being founded in 1873. Their membership is confined to the Old Boys of Christ's Hospital, the Blue Coat School and with the school at Horsham supplying a stream of recruits the Old Blues are able to run as many teams as any club in the country. Of all their old players perhaps the most famous was the late Sir George Rowland Hill, Hon. Sec. of the Rugby Football Union 1900-04, and President 1904-07. Sir Rowland's photo may be found in practically every club's pavilion in the country. Unfortunately that which hung in ours before the blitz has not been replaced. Here are the last four results of our games with them:

1946, Bath 12, Old Blues 8, 1947, Bath 9, Old Blues 8, 1948, Bath 17,

Old Blues 0. 1949, Bath 21, Old Blues 6.

Last season's Bath score was 3 goals 2 dropped goals, while the visitors got 2 penalty goals, the Bath scorers being Sullivan 3 goals, O'Shaughnessy and Moores a dropped goal each, Wilcox 2 tries and Donnelly I. The Bath team last season was Sullivan, Donnelly, O'Shaughnessy, Moores, Williams, Wilcox, Hanna, Roberts, Francis, Smith, Harter, Sheppard, T. Lewis, Dingle and Brown. It is interesting to note that of those in the 1947 team—only 3 years ago—A. Todd and L. Moores are the only playing members now, if we pass over Jack Arnold. Here is the 1947 team, J. Arnold, A.
