



To day we welcome Neath whom we have not met for several seasons, the last time I think was during Mervyn Shaw's captaincy. They have always been in the first flight of Welsh rugby and their record for this season proves that they are exceptionally strong, for they have won 9 of their 14 games, drawn 2 and lost 3, with 127 points for and 56 against. To-day's game should be a very tight affair for strangely enough Bath have won 9, drawn 1, lost 4 and the points are now on the right side with 107 for and 91 against. Fixtures with Neath have been renewed mainly through the efforts of Mr. A. E. Freethy who was Hon. Sec. for a couple of years after the war. He will be remembered as perhaps the most sought after referee in the 1920's. A member of the Welsh R.U., he now devotes much of his time to coaching both players and referees. How many remember his famous ex-school boys XV. he once brought to Bath and how many have heard our last week's captain, John Roberts, sing about Neath? Here's his effort.

"I have a brother Keith

LAST WEEK

And here, the first chance I have had let me congratulate Tom Smith on his selection for Somerset. They tell me his father was delighted but no more than Bath club members who have watched him this season. The Somerset v. Dorset and Wilts, game is on the Police ground at Taunton at 2.45 and here A. Lewis, T.
