



Once again welcome Bristol.

No match is looked forward to more eagerly by Bathonians than the Bristol match. This has been so since the days of Buster Soane and Tommy White, G. A. Lamond, J. W. Jarman and Perry Down. Interest in these games has never waned and certainly to-day seems greater than ever, and so we give our visitors as hearty a welcome as we ever have done. Should the weather allow it, to-day's game should be one of the best of the long series. If the record is anything to go by there should not be a lot in it at the end Bristol have played 10, won 6, drawn 0, lost 4, points for 103, against 81. Bath have played 10, drawn 1, lost 3, points for 56, against 68. Both teams are doing exceptionally well just now. Bristol have won each of their last half a dozen games and Bath have lost only one—at Penzance—of their last seven. Bristol made history last week when they defeated Aldershot Services despite the fact that they had twelve players away in county games. This shows that our visitors must have no end of players to call upon mainly owing to the happy relations which exist between them and the Bristol Combination Clubs.

Last Season.

At Bristol on October 15th, there was one of the most exciting finishes. Bath were well down until the last stages of the game when they fought back splendidly and put on tries by Addenbrooke and Alec Lewis to just lose by 13 pts. to 11 pts. From that team Bath makes four changes to-day, Hambly, John, Brown and Todd coming in for Hopkins, O'Shaughnessy, Harter and Burcombe. Bristol's side has changed very considerably. Fred. Hill played against us and of to-day's side, Gregory, Dabyiel, Golledge, Melall, Hopton Scott, Pratten and Woodward played then. Here at Bath, the result was a draw. Bath I p.g. (Sullivan), Itry (T. Lewis), Bristol 2 tries.

Our County

The result of the county game at Cambourne last Saturday was pleasing but perhaps a little surprising. Those of us who were at Penzance a few weeks ago formed the opinion that Cornwall would have a very strong side. Perhaps they have and if so all the more credit to good old Somerset. Our two representatives both did well and should have made certain of their places at Gloucester next week. If Somerset's forwards can produce the form they showed here last November 12th they should win again. Their remaining games then will be November 11th Berkshire at Bath, Dorset and Wilts on Police Ground at Taunton November 25th and Devon on December 9th at Weston. The other county games next week are Berkshire v. Cornwall at Reading and Devon v. Dorset and Wilts at Barnstaple. What a fine show Bath put up and what a good time we had on our only visit to Barnstaple!
