Once again we extend a very cordial welcome to our old friends the London Scottish and say, without fear of contradiction, that there is no side on our list whom we like better to meet whether here or at Richmond than our visitors to-day. What rousing games we have had with them to be sure! and what fine open play has resulted. Here is a list of recent games. In the 1946-47 season Bath brought off the double and of course are one leg up this season and, while of course Bath are out to repeat the dose to-day, the Scots are equally keen to prevent it which all means that we should have a hard, keen and most interesting game. If the weather be kind at long last and, at the time of writing there is every prospect that it may be, there are prospects that we may see scoring by the backs. The Scottish will throw the ball about that's a cert. and it's time we had some tries from the Bath backs for there have been none since Brian French got one against the Wasps on February 24th. Since then, we have put on 52 points. And of the 55 tries scored this season the forwards have got 29 to the backs 26.

NEXT WEEK.

It is to be hoped that we shall be able to take a full side to Bridgwater on Thursday evening next. Presumably there will be a late kick off. Past experience has taught us that Bridgwater are a very difficult side to beat and we know that this game must not be treated lightly. Last season here on October 8th we managed to win when Somerset were playing Devon by 2 g. 1 d.g., 13 pts., to 1 p.g. 2 t., 9 pts., Donnelly getting 2 tries and Sullivan 2 goals and a dropped goal. The last time we were at Bridgwater on October 23rd, 1948, the score was Bath 0 and Bridgwater 1 g. 1 p.g.
