

They are doing exceptionally well this season, altho' they somewhat diappointed some of us when they met Newport a few days ago. Our trips to Leicester have always been most enjoyable for the Tigers have the reputation of being a very sociable and jolly crowd. And what famous players we have met among them! The Bros.
