

### St. Mary's from Town.

There are no more popular visitors to our ground than the "Belles of St. Mary's" and we are pleased to extend to them our usual most cordial welcome, being certain they will give us a real good game, and hoping that they will stay with us this evening until the last train home. Even if some prefer to stay the night it will not be the first time that some of their members have done so. After all, perhaps it was just as well that "Ole man river" behaved as he did on Nov. 25th for now we have today's game to look forward to whereas if things had worked out as planned that would have been a thing of the past. We owe our best thanks to the St. Mary's officials for agreeing to switch over so willingly for it must have entailed much work and inconvenience to them.

When we visited St. Mary's on Nov. 25th. the result was a draw of a goal all. Our guests today then have the honour if such it be, of being the only London side to escape defeat from us. Where such sides as London Scottish, London Welsh, London Irish and Old Cranleighians have succumbed, St. Mary's have survived.

When the "Medicals" were last here on Nov. 26th, 1949 we won by 15pts. to 6. That was the day when Leslie Moores created a sensational record by kicking four penalty goals, of course everyone remembers that, and will for all time. In London last season, on Jan. 28th, Jack Frost prevented play. Before today's game St. Mary's have played 19, Won 5, Drawn 2, Lost 12, with 150 pts. for and 219 pts. against

#### Last Week.

The Cardiff game last week has been talked about more than any within living memory. There would be no need to worry about finance, even if games were lost, if such rugby could be served up every week. That was the general opinion, and with such sides as Gloucester, Leicester, Wasps, Swansea, Headingley, London Scottish and Moseley still to visit us, there should not be a lot to worry about financially.

#### Next Week.

And next week we are due at Rodney Parade, Newport, to meet the team of the season who have 20 wins and no losses. Wales are playing Scotland at Murray-field so Ken Jones will be away. When we last visited Newport on Feb. 18, 1950, we lost 21 to 8, Newport putting on most of the points in the last quarter of an hour. Newport experimented that day by playing Ken Jones as right centre. Roberts got a try and Sullivan a goal and a penalty goal, Guy Addenbrooke got damaged 20 mins. from the end, but played on with a broken arm. He did not play again until the Hylton Cleaver game here on Sept. 14. For some reason, known only to the Newport people, the kick-off has been fixed for as late as 3.15 p.m.
