THE SERVICES FROM DEVON.

Our usual welcome to the "Sons of the Sea" from Devonport today. They are one of the few teams whom we play twice in a season now. Records show that Bath have usually had the better of the games played since the war, indeed the Services have not won since 1949 when on the R.N.E. College ground they defeated us by 1 g. 1 d.g. and 3 tries and on the Rectory Field Devonport last season on March 24th they scored a try to our penalty goal by Drewett. We won the game here pretty comfortably by 4 goals, all by Sullivan, the Services failing to score. The Bath side was P. Sullivan, R. Woodward, A. Asquith, G. Trenchard, R. Guest, J. Thomas, R. Shuttleworth, J. Roberts, G. Clements, T. Smith, F. Thomas, E. Hopton, K. Box, J. Kendall Carpenter and R. Blackmore only six of whom are playing today. Woodward got 2 tries and Box and Shuttleworth one each.

This year the Services have got off to a good start. They defeated Teignmouth last Saturday by 21 points and on Wednesday at Sidmouth they won by 35 points to 3.

The composition of their side naturally changes from week to week, and much depends on what ships are in port, but one thing our players have always found the Services are always a jolly crowd to meet, whether here or at the Rectory, and we hope they will enjoy the game and the "afters" here to-day as much as we have always done at Devonport. And we trust many of our members will meet them in the Club House after tea to see that they do so.

We especially welcome back John Thomas to-day, remembering the good work he did last season, when he improved our back play no end. We trust he has come to stay.
