IT'S BEEN a long, hard season for Sale and it could hardly end in a tougher fashion – the penultimate game against Leicester, albeit with home advantage but then to finish the season off with a game at the Recreation Ground – it's a tall order! But Sale have been rising to challenges all season and proving along the way that they CAN compete with the best in Division One.
