

#### BATH v. PLYMOUTH ALBION

Plymouth Albion is such a nice Club, such nice people and such old friends, that it would be easy to be lulled into thinking that this evening we could sit back and enjoy a nice easy-

going game of rugby.

First, a lot of the 'United Boys' are in the Bath line-up; but this is not because we underestimate Albion, no, it is because our 'supposed' reserves are currently in electrifying form. In December (Divisional month) they did themselves very well indeed, with wins over London Scottish, Richmond and London Welsh; while two weeks back a total of 7 United men played against a Gloucester team lacking only Mike Teague. And the result of 12 - 9 to Bath reflects how superbly these same Bath men fit in whenever the call-up comes. Assuming all goes well therefore, soon we will both field a 1st Division side.

Many congratulations to the players last week at Richmond. Six tries (against none) away from home in Cup rugby is surely cause for satisfaction. Anyway, it was good enough for us. And Moseley v. Bath for the semi-finals? Well, one doubts we will drop our guard as we did two years ago. The Midlanders have strong forwards and they'll play to that strength; but there will be no danger on this occasion that we'll underestimate them.

Meanwhile, give a great cheer for Albion and Bath.
