NORTHAMPTON, the club that pioneered the Director of Rugby role, have turned this season to one of the top coaches in the world to guide their fortunes, Ian McGeechan.

The former Scotland and British Lions coach officially started on October 1, and his influence is becoming increasingly apparent.

He has been left with a mountain to climb this season to keep the Saints in Courage League Division, after the side lost its opening six games before arresting the slump against Gloucester followed by a win over West Hartlepool before the mid-season break.

McGeechan has expressed his desire that Northampton becomes a centre for excellence for young players, and he has plenty of exciting young talent to work

with at Franklin's Gardens, lurking just below the surface of the first team squad. Last season the East Midlands, made up entirely of Northampton players, won the Under 21 county championship, and many of that side have made their senior debuts this season.

Names to note for the future are Grant Seely (no 8) and Budge Pountney (open side flanker), Irish scrum half Andy Gallagher prop Matt Volland (tipped by Tim Rodber as a future international) and winger Craig Moir.

McGeechan admits he did not expect to be embroiled in a relegation fight but is relishing the challenge it presents. Although anchored to the foot of the table, the players have pledged to keep Northampton in the top flight.
