SPOTLIGHT NEWCASTLE FALCONS

ewcastle Falcons started their Zurich

Premiership campaign in impressive style last weekend with a 30-9 three try demolition of newly-promoted Worcester Warriors and arrive at the Rec this afternoon hoping to continue their good form against last season's Zurich Premiership finalists.

Last season's Powergen Cup champions will be out to prove a point or two this season. A disappointing Zurich Premiership campaign last season is now but a distant memory as Rob Andrew's side head into this campaign and a return to Heineken Cup action with renewed optimism.

A summer of change at Kingston Park has resulted with eight members of last season's playing squad departing for pastures new. The most notable absentees this season are international second row duo Garath Archer and Mark Andrews, both have decided to hang their boots up. Will they miss

the hard graft of Archer and Andrews? Well, only time will tell, but the early season indications are good. Both had massive presence on the field and were equally as influential off it, but the Falcons still possess plenty of experience in the boiler house. Stuart Grimes is an experienced international campaigner, whilst at 6'9" Luke Gross is the tallest player in the Premiership and is a consistent performer at the highest level.

Indeed the Falcons' pack will be a force to be reckoned with this season. Some shrewd recruitment has seen Wales Captain Colin Charvis make the switch from Tarbes and he arrives with a point to prove having spent the past season playing second division rugby in France. Samoan number eight Semo Sititi has also joined and alongside Charvis, will provide a strong ball carrying option from the base of the scrum. Young Mike McCarthy is also an outstanding prospect in the back row. Co-captain Ian Peel, Andy Long and Marius Hurter also provide a solid platform in the front row.

In the back division Matt Burke looks set to debut this afternoon. The World Cup winning Wallaby spent the summer with the Australian national side playing in the Tri Nations in the Zurich Premiership in some of the best form of his life. A quality player, Matt will add both considerable experience and direction to what will be an exciting Newcastle back division this season.

Of course you can't talk about the back line without giving a mention to that man Jonny! England's World Cup hero - a national treasure - is continuing his comeback after nine months sidelined with a shoulder injury. With both the media and Rob Andrew talking up his performances since his return, the signs are good for the Falcons and for England.

The fly half is the kingpin of what is one of the best back divisions in the Zurich Premiership, but he is not the only star in the side as the likes of Tom May, Michael Stephenson, Jamie Noon, Mark Mayerhofler and Dave Walder are all outstanding players in their own right and proved that last season in Jonny's enforced absence through injury.

An exciting season lies in wait and there is no doubt that the Zurich Premiership will be more competitive than every before. Northampton Saints, London Wasps, Gloucester, Bath Rugby and Leicester Tigers may be the favourites with the bookies, but do not discount the challenge of the Falcons - they
