ven the most ardent and one eyed Bath supporter will freely admit that life is never dull being a Bristol supporter!

After the transfer merry go round of the close season and the guesswork derived from Bristol's preseason friendly

The Welsh regions were certainly more in evidence at the competition launch earlier this week although the fact that the launch took place in Cardiff may have been a factor.


One thing is for certain, however. It's Bristol vs Bath and, whatever the competition and whoever is playing, both teams will be giving it 100%. May the best side win.
