RAG DOLL

This afternoon's match between Bath Rugby and Llanelli Scarlets will be significant for the renewal of one of rugby's oldest traditions - winning possession of the Rag Doll, but, as Dom Rumbles discovers, there is some uncertainty regarding the origins of this great tradition.

Tou would be forgiven for missing one of rugby's oldest traditions in this afternoon's second Powergen Cup semifinal but if you look a little closer at the posts you may just notice what appears to be a teddy bear tied to one of the uprights.

The three foot tall 'Rag Doll' has been a permanent fixture of matches between these two great sides for almost a century. Donned in the colours of the side that won the last encounter, the Rag Doll is hoisted up onto the upright where it is strapped in place to view the battle between these two sides before being presented to the winning captain.
