
Saracens

aracens head into this match which takes on epic significance knowing that nothing other than a win will suffice if they are to stave off the lingering threat of relegation. Like it or not, the earlyseason pace-setters (they topped the table after the opening few rounds) have been hauled into the relegation dog fight after a season in which they have blown both hot and cold.

At their best Saracens can be a breathtaking side to watch. Anyone who made the trip to Vicarage Road earlier in the season to see the Zurich Premiership clash between the two clubs would verify that. They are a side capable of beating anyone on their day, and have recorded significant victories over Colomiers and Newcastle Falcons on



their way to the semi-finals of the Parker Pen Challenge Cup.
