

fter the turmoil of the summer of 2007, things have finally settled down in Edinburgh under the leadership of former Bath Rugby flanker Andy Robinson.

Turning the clock back, Edinburgh's very existence was threatened but a compromise was found with the Scottish Rugby Union and the region survived.

Having reformed in 1996 as Edinburgh Rugby to compete in the Heineken Cup, Edinburgh later merged with Border Reivers to form 'Edinburgh Reivers'. The Reivers label didn't stay for long and although the team became known as the Edinburgh Gunners, the term was dropped in 2006.

Edinburgh's best achievements to date came in the 2003/04 season, when they reached the final of the Celtic Cup and became the first Scottish side to reach the quarter-finals of the Heineken Cup.

Robinson was appointed in October 2007 and he

the Magners league and eventually finished in fourth place.

Edinburgh signings over the summer have been relatively low key (though Scottish international fly-half Chris Patterson did return after a season in the Guinness Premiership with Gloucester) with new additions helping to add strength in depth to the squad.

Edinburgh will be looking towards today's match to help prepare themselves for another assault on the Magners league and their Heineken Cup campaign where they have been put in a group with Castres, Leinster and London Wasps.
