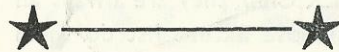

LAW 33. INFRINGEMENTS IN OWN IN-GOAL.

What happens if a throw forward or knock on occurs in-goal?

If a defender knocks on or throws forward, the Advantage Law is allowed to operate; if an attacker first grounds the ball, a try is awarded, if a defender first grounds it, a five yard scrum in the field of play, opposite where the infringement occurred is given; the attacking team putting in the ball. If an attacker knocks on or throws forward,—a drop out.
