It is a far cry from the days when Wellington were one of the finest sides in the country, and the days when Bridgwater could put into the field the Bridgwater and Bridgwater Albion sides, and the days of the old Somerset Cup battles. Whether forward or outside, let us have good sporting play and we shall be satisfied.
