WELCOME TO GLOUCESTER UNITED.

One of the finest games in which the United have participated this season was that against Gloucester United at Kingsholm on Nov. 13th, and whilst we in Bath may be inclined to take this view, our decision may be influenced by the fact that on that day we won by 9 - 3. If such is the case we ask to be excused.

It was surprising to learn at Gloucester that day that the "Cestrians" have not run a regular United XV. this season, being satisfied to turn out a side now and then to play some of the old opponents only. This is not due to lack of players, as we shall undoubtedly see to-day, but owing to the fact that the spacious Kingsholm is called upon to stage a large number of games apart from Club matches, and so a regular United team fixture list was not possible.

Few, if any, games on the 'Rec.' evoke more interest than do those with Glo'ster. And so to-day, whilst undoubtedly the majority of the crowd will shout "Up Bath", out of club loyalty, many will still be appreciative of good rigger from either side.
