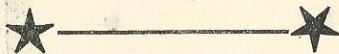

Good Old Somerset.

A bit late perhaps but congratulations to Somerset on heading the South Western Championship Group. A pity perhaps that Newport are due here on Feb. 2nd or the Semi Final v. Lancashire might have been staged here, but we could not put off the Usksiders. Taunton will be the venue now, some recompense perhaps for them for missing the International Trial last season. Lancashire last met Somerset in 1935 and won the Championship here at Bath, for Somerset went down by 14 clear points. The Cidemen were again in the Final in 1939 but they lost to Warwickshire at Weston by 8 points to 3 points. If, and a very big one - Somerset win at Taunton they will have to play on March 8th either in the Midlands or the South East. On that day Bath will be at Swansea.
