### THE 'BELLES' OF ST. MARY'S.

While it is yet too early in the season to name the strongest of the Metropolitan clubs there is little doubt that St. Mary's Hospital—our visitors to-day—were the outstanding London club last year and when at full strength, and including their two English internationals, N. M. Hall (outside half) and E. K. Scott (centre), St. Mary's were probably the strongest combination in the four countries. Once again they completed their big event by winning the Hospitals' Cup and, for the fourth time in five years, winning the Middlesex Seven-a-Side Tournament at Twickenham. In their competition they gained a comfortable victory over Cardiff who had surprised the critics by defeating the Kiwis in the semi-final. Last season St. Mary's were one of the few clubs to bring off the double against Bath, winning by a large margin at Twickenham and gaining a one-point victory on the Rec. With Bath getting back into the splendid form of last mid-season—remembering they have just won three games in one week—there should be a grand battle to-day, in a game in which anything may happen. Our followers should give them a very special welcome for they come here and Bath do not have the expense of going to London, while home and away games have been arranged for next season. One cannot write of St. Mary's without mentioning England's full back H. J. Owen Smith who was such a friend of our own dear Gerry.

Club members will be pleased to know that the committee has asked Joe Bailey to captain the United and they could not have made a better choice. His experience should work wonders with the United's young players who should count themselves very fortunate in having such a grand old player to lead them on.
