

With Clifton our visitors and if weather and conditions permit, we are assured of a rousing open game today. One of the oldest clubs in the country they have been on our list for many seasons now and games with them have always been most enjoyable and eagerly looked forward to. Established in 1872 they have had several homes and are now very comfortable at Eastfield Road where they have very well equipped dressing rooms and a club house wherein they entertain their visitors after home games. Owing to injuries and retirements they started last season poorly but finished with 8 home wins and found several very promising young players who are serving them well this season.

Last season on Dec. 9 we played them on their ground, when Somerset were losing that crucial match to Devon at Exeter and we won by Ig. 2tr. to Ipg. with the following side— L. Moores. W. Williams, K. Wilcox, C. Bowell, W. Donnelly, G. Hawkes, J. Roberts (Capt.), J. Francis, P. Sheppard, L. Harter, G. Brown, J. Vaissiere, A. Todd and M. Webb, Alan Todd got 2 tries, J. Vaissiere I and Roberts kicked the goal.

Today Clifton will be without B. A. Tuttiett whom we all hope will be continuing his really excellent work as Somerset's scrum half in which position he played all 5 Somerset games last season. In his place today we shall see Roger Whyte, Clifton's captain and utility man, who appears equally well in any position behind the scrum. He will want a lot of watching today as he did last season, when he showed that if given the chance he can make good use of a penalty.

When Clifton were last here on Easter Tuesday, 1950, there was no score.

LAST WEEK.

Generally speaking perhaps Bath were just a bit unlucky to lose last week, but then the Scottish would have been more so had they lost. Just a dozen penalty goals have been scored against Bath, 2 more than tries and one or more in every game except St. Mary's, United Services and Met. Police. Paddy Sullivan has kicked 5 and Alec Lewis 4. What we want of course are more tries and preferably from the wings. Most supporters will probably be pleased that Ken Wilcox has been re-installed although not at outside half. It is perhaps bad luck on young Hughes for he has by no means done badly. It's more than likely that he will soon be back in the firsts.

THE COUNTY.

The result from Wellington will be eagerly awaited this afternoon. A draw or a win by Somerset will place them in the same final in which they will have to meet the champions of the North in Somerset. To play that game at Bath would be quite out of the question for Bath play Newport here on that day.
