

Our Captain has received countless messages of congratulation on his selection for England but on behalf of everyone in the crowd to-day, this is to extend to him our very best wishes that he will have a real good game on Jan. 5th and fully justify the confidence that the English Selectors have placed in him. That he will do this we Bathonians who have watched his progress during the past four seasons are very certain.

Alec's first game for Bath was v. Swansea here on Sept. 18th, 1948, and he got his first try for us on the following Saturday v. Devon Services, here. Since then he has done wonderful service for us as the following shows. 1948-49 33 games - 17 tries 1949-50 28 games - 5 tries. 1950-51 31 games - 12 tries, 8 gls, 4 pen. gls, 1 d. gl. 1951-52 10 games including to-day - 7 tries, 4 p. gls.
